## RESOLUTION 06-08-23

A resolution to approve the pilot colleges recommended by the Community and Technical College Opportunity Grant Pilot Program Review Committee and authorizing the selected pilot colleges to receive the appropriate 2006-07 funding and begin implementing pilot programs.

**WHEREAS** consistent with the Washington State Legislature's requirement of the State Board for Community and Technical Colleges, the State Board developed objective criteria related to selection of the Community and Technical College Opportunity Grant Pilot programs; and


**WHEREAS** the Community and Technical College Opportunity Grant Pilot Program Review Committee found the colleges identified below provided evidence of meeting or exceeding these criteria and that these colleges presented proposals that will help low-income adults to progress further and faster along career pathways leading to employment in demand occupations,

**THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED** that the State Board for Community and Technical Colleges approves the recommendations of the Review Committee to select the following pilot colleges:

- Bellingham Technical College/Whatcom Community College (\$432,000)
- Big Bend Community College (\$399,000)
- Clover Park Technical College (\$419,000)
- Edmonds Community College (\$432,000)
- Highline Community College (\$432,000)
- Olympic College (\$305,000)
- Peninsula College (\$370,000)
- Shoreline Community College (\$416,000)
- Yakima Valley Community College (\$363,000)
- Walla Walla Community College (\$432,000)

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** that the State Board for Community and Technical Colleges commends the members of the Community and Technical College Opportunity Grant Pilot Program Review Committee for their thoughtful and thorough work in evaluating the proposals for these pilot programs.

A resolution allocating and awarding \$4,238,028 of Workforce Development and High Demand funds to the community and technical colleges.

**WHEREAS** the State Board has the authority to allocate and award Workforce Development and High Demand funds; and

**WHEREAS** a competitive process has been completed in accordance with recognized protocol;

**THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED** that the State Board for Community and Technical Colleges awards a total of \$4,238,028 FY06 funding as presented in detail in tables 1, 2 and 3 of the State Board agenda, Tab 2, pages 1-2:

1. Table 1 - \$1,926,000 for High Demand
2. Table 2 - \$1,496,000 for High Demand Supplemental
3. Table 3 - \$ 816,028 for Workforce Development Grants
