Fully funding our 2019-2021 operating and capital budget requests will have real returns for students like Maleah Woodley, for our community, and for employers in our area. With full funding, our students will learn from exceptional instructors who will receive competitive compensation. They will reap the benefits of “Guided Pathways” — a redesign of course sequencing and advising that gives students a bright-line path into careers and universities. And, they will have more access to training in high-demand areas like nursing, allied health, biotechnology, computer science, automotive and advanced manufacturing. The capital investments would fund design work for the STE(A)M Education Center and construction of the Allied Health, Science and Manufacturing Complex.

Operating Budget Estimate

If the system’s operating budget request of \$189 million is fully funded, Shoreline Community College would receive approximately \$6.1 million in additional funding.

Capital Budget Estimate

If the system’s capital request for \$627 million is fully funded Shoreline Community College will receive approximately \$3.8 million for operation, maintenance, repairs and minor improvements of its existing facilities, approximately \$2.8 million for design of the STE(A)M Education Center project and approximately \$36.6 million for construction of the Allied Health, Science & Manufacturing project.
