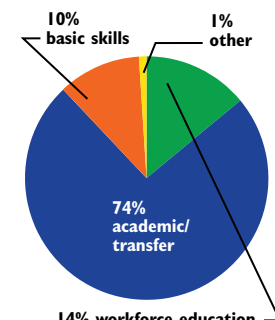

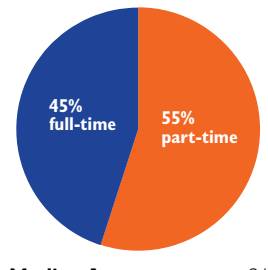

POINTS OF INTEREST

Serving Local Employers Through Job Skills Training

Cascadia, in partnership with Everett's Continuing and Corporate Education Center, has obtained approximately \$800,000 in grants through the Job Skills Program since 2013. These funds are matched by expanding local businesses to provide onsite training and education for their employees. Industries served by this collaboration include manufacturing, aerospace manufacturing, communications and information technology.

Cascadia and UW Bothell Student Collaboration

The Activities & Recreation Center (ARC) is up and running. This student-funded facility represents nearly 10 years of collaboration between students at Cascadia and UW Bothell. They negotiated the amenities and resources it would house, worked with finance offices to develop a funding proposal, joined architects and contractors to come up with a design, then planned the grand opening. They are now responsible for developing long-term strategic plans and helping manage the ARC's daily operations, which include a fitness center, student leadership offices, a community resource center, meeting rooms, and a multipurpose event and gathering space.

Sustained Enrollment Growth

Since 2011-12, Cascadia has experienced five years of steady enrollment growth. The increase is concentrated in STEM programs, Running Start students, and Latino students. Our hybrid courses and College in the High School courses are increasingly popular. The college is on track for another year of growth during the 2016-17 academic year.
