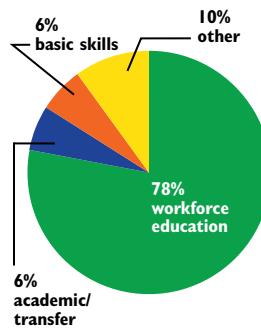

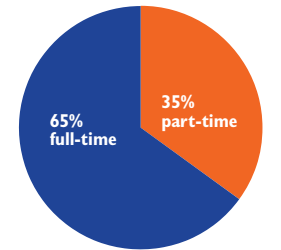

Workforce Education A leader in workforce education, Clover Park Technical College (CPTC) is well positioned to drive economic development in south Puget Sound. CPTC recently received a nearly \$2.5 million grant from the Department of Labor to expand educational fields like the Mechatronics program to better meet the needs of business and industry. Since the majority of our students have to balance full- or part-time jobs and school, our programs and class schedules are designed to accommodate busy work schedules as students gain the skills and knowledge to advance in their desired careers. We're educating tomorrow's workforce.

Innovative Programs We offer hands-on education using state-of-the-art technology. Our Bachelor of Applied Science in Operations Management — the first bachelor of applied science degree offered in Pierce County — gives workers in numerous areas the education they need to move into management positions. Our fully online Retail Business Management degree allows students to move forward in their careers while working full time. Our new Digital Entertainment Design program gives students the skills to work in video and game production.

Student Success Our programs give students the skills they need to succeed in the workforce. Our Aviation Maintenance Technician students average among the highest pass rates in the nation for FAA certification. Our Medical Histology Technician students have achieved a 93 percent pass rate on the National Certification exam. During the 2015-16 academic year, our Dental Assistant students achieved a 100 percent pass rate on their General Chairside exams.
