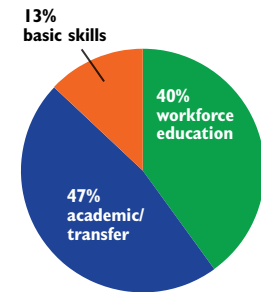

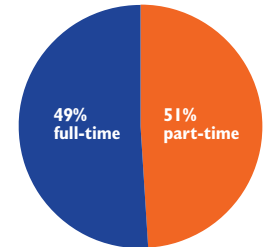

POINTS OF INTEREST

Workforce An independent study from EMSI, a firm specializing in regional economic impact, shows Columbia Basin College (CBC) has an annual impact of \$467 million or 4.1 percent of local economic activity. The report shows 7,891 jobs result from CBC-generated economic activity. CBC continues to offer new programs to put people to work. This fall, CBC is offering eight new workforce certificate programs in everything from blueprint reading to logistics technician, introduction to SolidWorks, and basic electricity.

Applied Bachelor's Degrees CBC is increasing its enrollment in current bachelor of applied science degrees and in the number of bachelor degrees offered to students. From the 2014-15 school year to 2015-2016, enrollment in the three current bachelor programs (Cyber Security, Applied Management, and Project Management) increased by 30 percent. CBC also is also awaiting approval for bachelor degrees in Nursing, Information Technology, and Dental Hygiene.

Human Development In 2012, CBC implemented a retention program to assist at-risk students. Human Development (HDEV) 101 Creating Academic Success targets new students who place below college level in two or more subject areas on the COMPASS student test. Students who completed the HDEV course were retained at a similar rate to the college-level students and surpassed retention rates for at-risk students who did not enroll in the HDEV course. This year, CBC is offering HDEV 102, which focuses on study skills, time management, higher education culture, self-awareness, academic advising, educational planning, and e-portfolio development. HDEV is a mandatory course for all college freshmen.
