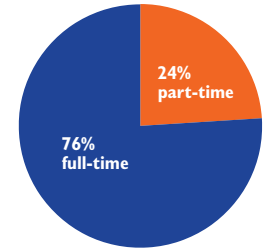
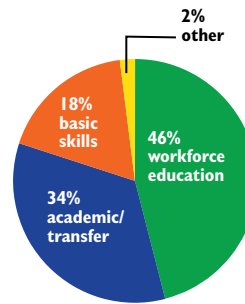

BASOM Launches In fall 2016, the first student cohort began course work in our new Bachelor of Applied Science in Organizational Management. The Bachelor of Applied Science in Education just received final approval and will be launched in fall 2017, with Centralia College and area school districts as our partners. A third Bachelor of Applied Science program in Forestry Resource Management is pending approval and will be offered cooperatively with Green River College.

Customizing Training for Businesses Grays Harbor College partners with area businesses, the Port of Grays Harbor tenants and local industry to provide customized, just-in-time training at the request of employers. Varying in length and focus, training sessions help boost workforce skills to meet employer demands, while workers stay on the job.
