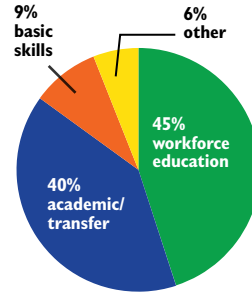

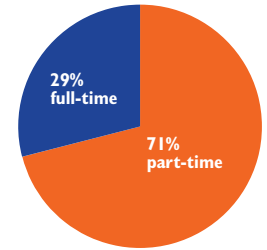

POINTS OF INTEREST

Early Childhood Education Bachelor's Degree

In January 2016, North Seattle College launched an Early Childhood Education Bachelor of Applied Science degree. The program represents a new standard for leadership and collaboration. It is the first Early Childhood Education BAS degree in the state, and the degree is taught by North faculty on its sister campus, Seattle Central College, in order to meet community needs. The cohort is tremendously diverse, with more than 72 percent of students from underrepresented groups in the inaugural cohort.

NSF Grant to Support STEM

North Seattle College was the recipient of a \$5 million National Science Foundation grant awarded to North, its sister campuses in the Seattle Colleges District and Seattle University in 2016. The grant builds on the successes of a previous grant and includes \$1 million in STEM scholarships for each of the three Seattle colleges.

\$3.8 Million Grant Connects Unemployed with Aerospace Industry

North was also one of five colleges to be awarded a federal grant totaling \$3.8 million. The Department of Labor TechHire grant enables the college and other recipients to partner with the Center of Excellence for Aerospace and Advanced Manufacturing to connect unemployed young adults to careers in the aerospace industry.
