



Growing University Partnerships

Olympic College continues to expand educational opportunities in Kitsap and Mason counties thanks to our partners in higher education. In 2016, Washington State University added an Electrical Engineering bachelor degree to its already successful Mechanical Engineering program available at our Bremerton Campus. Next year, Western Washington University (WWU) will offer a Cybersecurity bachelor degree program at our Poulsbo campus in addition to the Multidisciplinary Studies program added this year. We also partner with Brandman and Old Dominion universities to offer degree programs with convenient in-person/online hybrid options.

Expanding our Facilities

We are investing in our students and our communities with three exciting new capital projects. In Bremerton, we are building the College Instruction Center, the largest, state-funded building in Washington's community and technical college system. This building will provide a state-of-the-art home for art, music, theater and health occupations programs. In Poulsbo, the addition of a new modular building allows more space for our growing partnership with WWU. At our Shelton campus, a new welding shop, set to begin construction in 2016-17, provides an on-site facility that will train highly-skilled workers in a good-paying field experiencing steady growth.

Strengthening our Commitment to Equity

This year, we will strengthen our commitment to student success under the leadership of Cheryl Nuñez, the college's first Vice President for Equity & Inclusion. In an effort to better use data to promote positive student outcomes, while reducing gaps across social membership groups, the college is launching a strategic Equity & Inclusion Plan. The plan framework includes a scorecard with goals and measures across all dimensions of the institution, new faculty and staff development offerings, a website and other communications vehicles, and supporting policies and initiatives that will catalyze and encourage the engagement of the college community in this important work.
