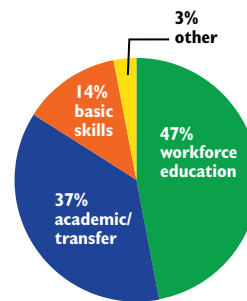

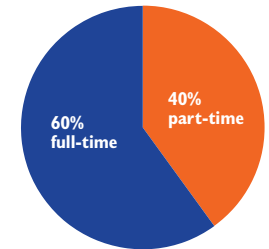

## POINTS OF INTEREST

**Job Creation and Renovations**

In August 2016 Peninsula College (PC), in partnership with the Port of Port Angeles, the City of Port Angeles and Clallam County, celebrated the ribbon cutting of The Composite Recycling and Technology Center in Port Angeles. PC has established worker training programs in partnership with the composites recycling industry to develop several levels of certification for students as well as comprehensive two-year degrees. Our composite recycling track is one of only two such programs in the state.

Building 202, our new facility at the Port Townsend campus at Fort Worden, provides high-quality education, easy access and up-to-date technology and infrastructure to better serve our students in east Jefferson County. Consistent with the mission of the college, the site provides opportunities in the areas of academic transfer, professional/technical programs, basic skills and continuing education.

**Guided Pathways Grant Awarded**

PC was one of five colleges selected by College Spark Washington and SBCTC to receive Guided Pathways implementation grants totaling \$2.5 million over five years. The award will help streamline the student experience from college entrance to program selection to degree completion, providing students with a much clearer, more efficient path to completion and credential.

**State of the Art Allied Health Building**

Our 41,650 square foot Allied Health and Early Childhood Development Center is slated to open in March 2017. The structure will include facilities for all of our healthcare programs as well as childcare and flexible spaces for in-demand programs.
