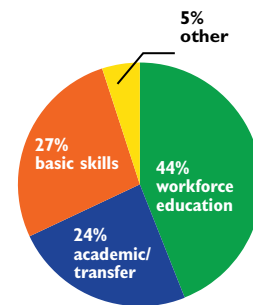

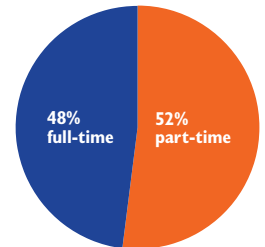

POINTS OF INTEREST

Workforce Training SCC and SFCC partner with the CCS Center for Workforce & Continuing Education (CWCE) and Spokane Workforce Development Council (SAWDC) to provide industry-driven corporate training and continuing education opportunities for local employers and their workers. It is through the CWCE that area employers are able to apply for state Job Skills Program grants and the customized training program to assist our local businesses with their training and professional development needs. The CWCE and the SAWDC also both work closely with Greater Spokane Incorporated in order to assist businesses in the community with employee development and training.

Allied Health SCC's allied health program is in the process of developing a Bachelor of Applied Science in respiratory care in response to local business needs. The goal is to have it offered beginning fall 2017. Another recent development was the purchase of a Wireless Digital Radiography System by the radiology technology program. These systems are designed for high patient volumes and serve a variety of clinical environments thereby exposing students to options they will face in their careers such as in emergency and trauma, imaging centers, orthopedic facilities and urgent care clinics.

I-BEST SCC currently offers 12 Integrated Basic Education and Skills Training (I-BEST) programs and plans to add more in a wide variety of academic areas. I-BEST programs vary in delivery model to best needs of the students with goal of accelerated success and completion. Each program is designed around the needs of the students and often targets areas where the additional support is most effective with the additional I-BEST support. On ramp programs for ESL student give students the opportunity to engage in these high-wage, high-demand pathways sooner by providing the opportunity to increase content specific skills prior to enrolling in I-BEST.
