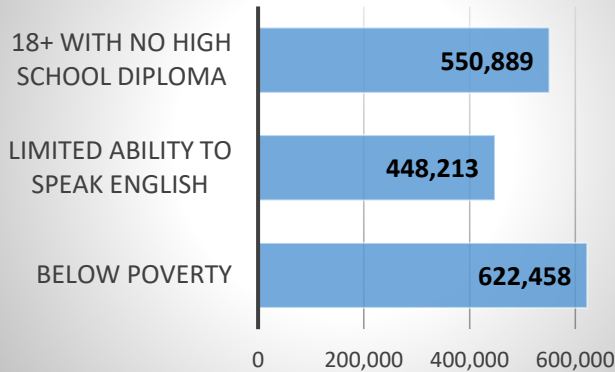

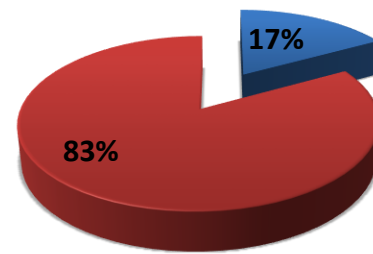
### BEa Target Population

Basic Education for Adults programs serve adults 16 years of age and older who are building academic skills for college and career readiness and acquiring English language skills. Instruction develops skills in reading, writing, math, English language, and preparation for earning a high school credential. Instruction provided in technology rich environments includes employability skills, such as effective relationships, workplace skills, and applied knowledge needed for transition to post-secondary education and career pathways.

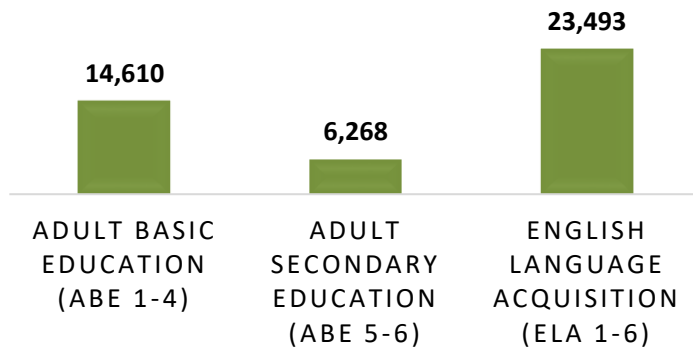

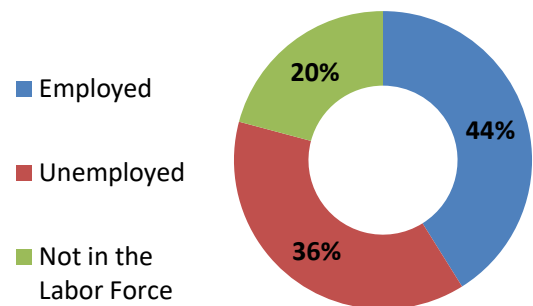

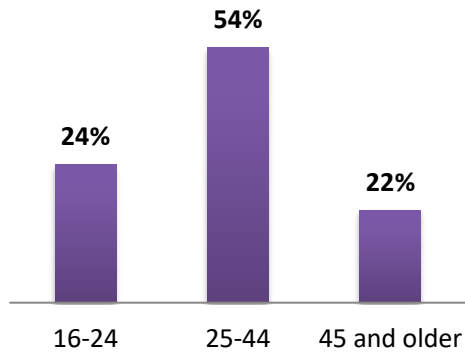


### Employment Status

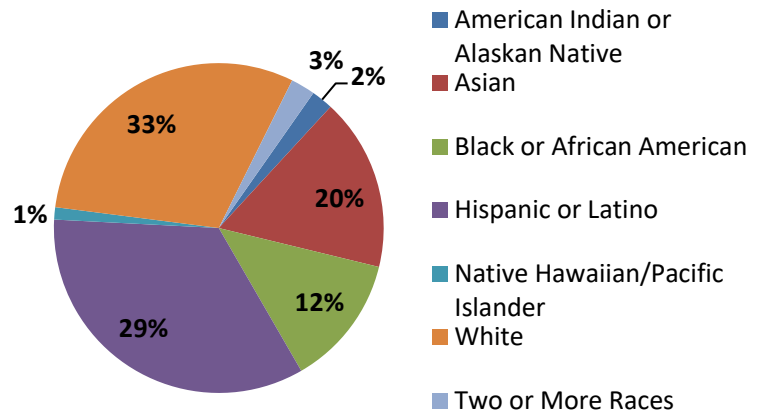

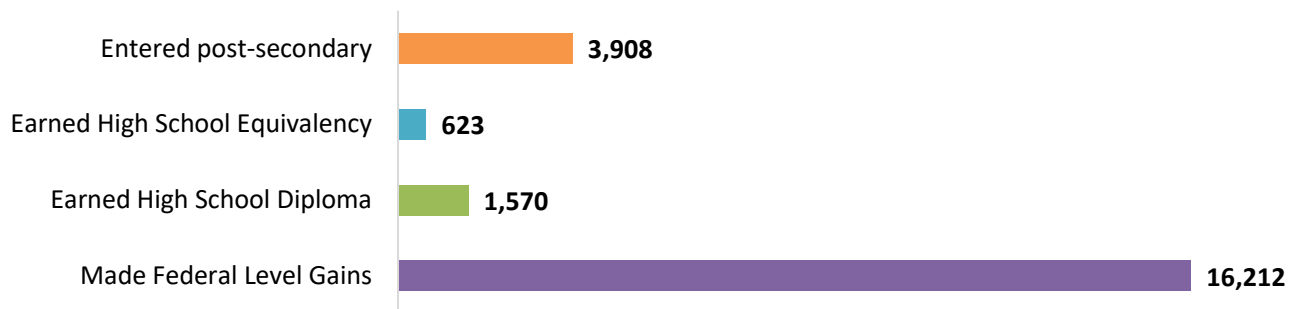
## Participant Age
