<u>Special Presentation – Emotional Intelligence.</u> Yakima Valley College Faculty Counselor Richard Schillinger

Emotional Intelligence (EI) is defined as "the capability of individuals to recognize their own, and others', emotions, to discern between different feelings and label them appropriately." It is a vital skill necessary in both professional and personal life. Counselor Schillinger discussed the five components of Emotional Intelligence, which include:

- Self-Awareness the ability to know one's emotions, strengths, weaknesses, drives, values and goals and recognize their impact on others while using "gut feelings" to guide decisions;
- Self-Regulation involves controlling or redirecting one's disruptive emotions and impulses and adapting to changing circumstances;
- Social Skill managing relationships to move people in the desired direction;
- Empathy considering other people's feelings especially when making decisions;
- Motivation being drive to achieve for the sake of achievement.
