Introduction

The Image/Upgrade Overview Document is intended to provide ctcLink users with a summary of the changes that will be made in the system as a result of the upcoming image or PeopleTools upgrade implementation. Oracle releases multiple PeopleSoft updates, called images, for each pillar every year. Each Image contains bug fixes and features that are important for PeopleSoft to work well. PeopleTools upgrades update the underlying framework of the system. There are minimal changes that are noticeable to the end users. Below is an overview of the changes that you can expect to see as part of this upgrade.

Payroll

Updated Federal / State Tax Table

Federal (State = \$U) - A new table entry effective-dated 01/01/2026 includes the increase in the Social Security taxable wage base from \$176,100 to \$184,500 for 2026. The Social Security tax rate on wages and tips remains unchanged at 6.2% for both employees and employers for 2026. https://www.ssa.gov/oact/cola/cbb.html

Note: U.S. Federal withholding tax changes for wages paid on or after 01 January 2026 had not yet been published in time for delivery in Tax Update 25-D.

Once published, the 2026 U.S. Federal withholding tax changes will be delivered in Tax Update 26-A.

Arizona (AZ) - A new table entry effective-dated 01/01/2026 is delivered with the Arizona state minimum wage increase from \$14.70 to \$15.15 per hour. https://www.azica.gov/labor-department

California (CA) - A new table entry effective-dated 01/01/2026 includes the following changes:

Colorado (CO) - A new table entry effective-dated 01/01/2026 includes the following changes:

- 1. The Colorado state minimum wage increase from \$14.81 to \$15.16 per hour. https://cdle.colorado.gov/dlss

Connecticut (CT) - A new table entry effective-dated 01/01/2026 includes the following changes:

Delaware (DE) - A new table entry effective-dated 01/01/2026 includes the following changes:

Hawaii (HI) - A new table entry effective-dated 01/01/2026 is delivered with the Hawaii state minimum wage increase from \$14.00 to \$16.00 per hour. https://labor.hawaii.gov/wsd/minimum-wage/

lowa (IA) - A new table entry effective-dated 01/01/2026 includes the following changes:

Massachusetts (MA) - The table entry effective-dated 01/01/2026, which was delivered with Tax Update 25-C, is updated to include the Massachusetts Paid Family & Medical Leave taxable wage base increase from \$176,100 to \$184,500 based on the increase in the Social Security OASDI maximum taxable wage base for 2026. https://www.mass.gov/info-details/paid-family-and-medical-leave-employer-contribution-rates-and-calculator

Maine (ME) - A new table entry effective-dated 01/01/2026 includes the following changes:

Michigan (MI) - A new table entry effective-dated 01/01/2026 is delivered with the Michigan state minimum wage increase from \$12.48 to \$13.73 per hour. https://www.michigan.gov/leo/bureaus-agencies/ber/wage-and-hour/min-wage

Minnesota (MN) - The table entry effective-dated 01/01/2026, which was delivered with Tax Update 25-C, is updated to include the following changes:

- 1. The Minnesota state minimum wage increase from \$11.13 to \$11.41 per hour. https://www.dli.mn.gov/minwage
- 2. The Minnesota Paid Family & Medical Leave taxable wage base increase from \$176,100 to \$184,500 based on the increase in the Social Security OASDI maximum taxable wage base for 2026. https://mn.gov/deed/paidleave/employers/premiums/

Missouri (MO) - A new table entry effective-dated 01/01/2026 includes the following changes:

- 1. The Missouri state minimum wage increase from \$13.75 to \$15.00 per hour. https://labor.mo.gov/dls/minimum-wage

New Jersey (NJ) - A new table entry effective-dated 01/01/2026 includes the following changes:

- The New Jersey state unemployment taxable wage base increase from \$43,300 to \$44,800 for 2026 for both employees and employers. The following employee unemployment tax rates remain unchanged for 2026: 0.003825 Unemployment Insurance (U.I.) 0.000250 Workforce Development Partnership Fund (W.D.P.F.) 0.000175 Supplemental Workforce Assessment Fund (S.W.A.F.) https://www.nj.gov/labor/ea/employer-services/rate-info/
- 2. The following values for temporary disability insurance and family leave insurance are updated for 2026:
 - a. The taxable wage base for employer contributions to temporary disability insurance

- increase from \$43,300 to \$44,800.
- b. The taxable wage base for employee contributions to temporary disability insurance and family leave insurance increase from \$165,400 to \$171,100.
- c. The employee tax rate for employee temporary disability insurance is decreased from 0.0023 to 0.0019.
- d. The employee tax rate for family leave insurance is decreased from 0.0033 to 0.0023.

Nevada (NV) - A new table entry effective-dated 01/01/2026 is delivered with Nevada state unemployment taxable wage base increase from \$41,800 to \$43,700 for 2026. https://detr.nv.gov/Page/UI_Tax#Taxable_Wage_Base

New York (NY) - A new table entry effective-dated 01/01/2026 includes the following changes:

- 1. The New York state unemployment taxable wage base increase from \$12,800 to \$13,000 for 2026. https://doi.nv.gov/voluntary-contributions-worksheet
- 2. The following values are updated for the New York Paid Family Leave program for 2026:
 - a. The taxable wage base is increased from \$91,374 to \$95,350.
 - b. The tax rate is increased from 0.003880 to 0.004320.
 - c. The annual maximum tax is increased from \$354.53 to \$411.91. (amount not included on state tax table).

Oregon (OR) - A new table entry effective-dated 01/01/2026 is delivered with the Oregon Paid Family & Medical Leave taxable wage base increase from \$176,100 to \$184,500 based on the increase in the Social Security OASDI maximum taxable wage base for 2026. https://paidleave.oregon.gov/employers/contributions-calculator.html/#calculator

South Dakota (SD) - A new table entry effective-dated 01/01/2026 is delivered with the South Dakota state minimum wage increase from \$11.50 to \$11.85 per hour. https://dlr.sd.gov/employment_laws/minimum_wage.aspx

Virginia (VA) - A new table entry effective-dated 01/01/2026 is delivered with the Virginia state minimum wage increase from \$12.41 to \$12.77 per hour.

Vermont (VT) - A new table entry effective-dated 01/01/2026 includes the following changes:

Washington (WA) - A new table entry effective-dated 01/01/2026 includes the following changes:

- 3. The Washington Paid Family & Medical Leave change in the Medical Leave Insurance EE Ratio from 0.5178 to 0.5195 and in the Family Leave Insurance EE Ratio from 0.4822 to 0.4805. The tax rate increases from 0.009200 to 0.01130. The ratios are derived based on a review of the calculation results from Washington Employment Security Department calculator and may result in occasional penny differences. https://paidleave.wa.gov/estimate-your-paid-leave-payments/
- 4. The Washington Paid Family & Medical Leave taxable wage base increase from \$176,100 to \$184,500 based on the increase in the Social Security OASDI maximum taxable wage base for 2026. https://paidleave.wa.gov/updates/

Local Tax Table Updates

Indiana (IN) - Indiana consolidated the following taxes into a single Local Income Tax (LIT) beginning with the 2017 tax year: County Adjusted Gross Income Tax (CAGIT), County Option Income Tax (COIT), and County Economic Development Income Tax (CEDIT).

Tax Update 25-D delivers a new row with Effective Date = 01/01/2026 to update the Local Tax Table entries for Indiana CAGIT (IN Localities ending in "CA"), COIT (IN Localities ending in "CO"), and

CEDIT (IN Localities ending in "CE") local taxes to inactivate them.

For employees with an Indiana local tax code ending in "CA," "CO," or "CE" on their Local Tax Data page, prior to running the first payroll with a Check Date on or later than 01/01/2026, these codes must be replaced by an Indiana local tax code without these suffixes.

Pay Calculation

Tax Update 25-D modified the respective processes to successfully process pay calculation where paysheet transactions are loaded by the on-cycle Load Paysheet Transactions process for an inactive employee in certain scenarios.

Prior to the modifications, the process ended with the following error: "... ORA-00001: unique constraint (SYSADM.PS_PAY_LINE) violated."

Image: Load Paysheet Transactions for On-Cycle Checks; Employee Group: Inactive.





Image: Calculate Payroll for On-Cycle Checks

Prior to the modifications, in some scenarios, the State FICA (memo earnings) tax class records were displayed on paychecks where residence state or work state were not Delaware. FICA (memo) is not displayed on the employee's paystub in self-service.




Image: Review Paycheck, Taxes. FICA(memo) displayed prior to Tax Update 25-D.
