SUBJECT:	2017-2018 Income Thresholds for Needy Waivers - RCW 28B.15.740 (1)
Community	allogge may waive all as a position of tuition (operating and building face) and convi

Community colleges may waive all or a portion of tuition (operating and building fees) and services and activities fees for financially needy students eligible for resident tuition within the 35 percent legislative limit, not to exceed three-fourths of one percent of tuition collections.

The following is a revised table of income thresholds to be used in determining "need" for the Needy tuition waiver program per the 2017-18 Washington Financial Aid Association (WFAA) Student Budgets documentation in combination with the Bureau of Labor Statistics most recent Consumer Price Index for Washington State for the 12 month period ending in August 2016. The monthly income threshold represents a 1.14 percent increase.
