Why Guided Pathways?

The Washington roundtable estimates **740,000 job openings** in **Washington** state by **2021**. To fill those jobs, the Roundtable set a **Goal: by the year 2030, 70% of Washington students will earn a postsecondary credential by age 26.** This requires **doubling postsecondary credential attainment.**

Early Indicators

Students who complete **college level math** within the **first year** complete their degree at a rate 30% higher than those who do not.
