

Dear Dr. Floyd:

The Transfer Task Force was created in the Fall of 1992 as a cooperative effort of the community colleges and public baccalaureate institutions. Representatives of the community college presidents and deans, baccalaureate institutions' undergraduate studies deans, other institutional representatives, and staff from the State Board for Community and Technical Colleges, the Council of Presidents' Office, and the Higher Education Coordinating Board participated in discussions and negotiations over the past year and a half. The participants were authorized to act on behalf of all the baccalaureate institutions and community colleges and unanimously endorsed the agreement.

Our major concern has been the increasing number of community college students prepared to transfer in pursuit of a baccalaureate degree and the changes needed to accommodate their needs for access. The Transfer Task Force's goal was to modify the current transfer agreement to take the present and projected changes into account.

Enclosed is the product of our work. At our most recent meeting, on March 14, we agreed on the principles and actions detailed in this document. We are forwarding it to you as a recommendation to the Higher Education Coordinating Board for adoption as part of the Board's transfer policies.

To implement this new agreement, we have asked a subcommittee, the Technical Advisory Committee, to reconvene in order to develop transfer mechanisms for students who have not found a suitable placement. That subcommittee has planned a meeting for April 20 to continue their work. We have also agreed that the Transfer Task Force itself should meet again this year, and at least annually in subsequent years, to review how the transfer policies and agreements are working for our students and institutions.
