High School Students Earn FREE College Credit NOW!

HOW to earn college credit?

YOU can earn Community/Technical College credit at the same time you earn high school credit by completing Career and Technical courses with a 'C' grade or better*. (effective Sept. 2019)

WHY earn college credit now?

- You save up to \$1,500 in college tuition before you graduate from high school.
- You stay on your high school campus and receive college credit.
- University Bound? Check with the admissions office for more information about their policy on credit transfer.
- Military bound? Earn a promotion and a pay raise with your college credits.

- Go to http://www.ctesers.org
- New students: click Create New SERS Account; Returning students, log in using your user name and password.
- Select Register for Classes under the Registration menu. To find all classes, click Search. To narrow your search, use the drop-down arrows, then click Search.
- Checkmark the classes you are taking this current school year.
- Click the **Register Classes** button at the bottom of the page.
- Checkmark the teacher who is teaching your class.
- When you have made your selections, click, Save & Register and repeat the process to change the class(es) you chose.
- To print a confirmation page for your records click on the printer icon at the top.
