ADA TITLE II ACCESSIBILITY COMPLIANCE DEADLINES

The U.S. Department of Justice’s final ruling on Title II of the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA):

- Impacts all Washington Community & Technical Colleges and the SBCTC agency
- Specifies a minimum technical standard: [Web Content Accessibility Guidelines \(WCAG\) 2.1 AA](#)
- Applies to web and mobile apps, including the following examples:
 - College websites (both platform and content)
 - Third-party web/mobile applications (e.g. ctLink, Highpoint HCX Mobile App, Student Success Software)
 - Electronic documents (e.g. Word, PowerPoint, PDF, Excel)
 - Digital instructional content
 - Canvas Learning Management System
 - Digital textbooks
- Takes effect for all SBCTC colleges **April 2026** (based on service district populations)

College Action Needed by December 31, 2024:

1. **College Presidents** – establish a local Accessible IT Task Force. (Suggested representation: Accessible IT Coordinator, Disability/Access Services, Information Technology, Public Information Office, Instruction, eLearning, Library, College Bookstore, Student Services, Human Resources, Public Records Officer, other campus stakeholders).
2. **IT Directors** – Enter your college’s Accessible IT Coordinator contact information (*Name, Job Title, Email, Phone*) into [SBCTC’s Accessible IT Coordinator collection form](#).
3. **College Website Administrators**
Post a statement on your college website acknowledging the DOJ’s ADA ruling.
 - ✓ Include the updated technical standard [WCAG 2.1 AA](#) and your compliance plan or intent to create a plan.
 - ✓ Revise/update all existing policy references to [WATech Policy USER-01](#) (Formerly OCIO Policy 188).
 - ✓ Clearly post the Name, Job Title, Email, and Phone of your college’s Accessible IT Coordinator.
 - ✓ Provide guidance for requesting alternate means of communication or reasonable modification of web content.
 - ✓ Provide at least one method (email, web form) for reporting a web or digital accessibility barrier.
4. **Accessible IT Coordinators** - Stay tuned for more information about a webinar for Coordinators on the DOJ ruling.
